Report of the Leadership Development Committee

June 2015

The Leadership Development Committee of the Missouri Mid-South Conference is largely charged with: cultivating and nurturing Conference leadership; ensuring the Conference fulfills its covenantal leadership obligations, including with other church ministries: and promoting the Conference's relationship with the church's historically related Seminaries, etc.

The committee, pursuant to the Bylaws and working with the associations, local churches and via the *eCourier*, solicited and **identified qualified leadership** candidates for election to the Conference Council. The names of those elected at the Conference Annual Gathering in June 2014 can be found in the minutes of that meeting and, separately, those being proposed for election in June 2015. Time was spent on identifying potential leaders, with particular attention on reflecting the diversity and demographic base of our congregations and their membership. The committee also considered individual professional expertise and experience which might be beneficial in fulfilling the legal and fiduciary duties, and accountability practices of the conference. We are blessed with having a wide range of individuals willing to accept the call to leadership.

The Missouri Mid-South **Conference Deacon program** offers another wonderful opportunity to serve our conference. We see great potential with this program enhancing our connectedness within the conference and expect to see wonderful things happening with a re-boot later in 2015. This program is one where time is the main commitment - and it is only required several times a year. Conference Deacons are unique individuals who serve because of their spiritual, emotional and ecclesial maturity and willingness to act as "connectors" within the body. The conference leadership recognizes the Deacon program is fundamental in nurturing the relationships with the Conference, by creating a rapport between congregations and individuals (rather than congregation connections solely with Conference staff). **Won't YOU serve?** Training and ongoing support is provided. As mentioned above, cultivating leadership for the Conference continues to be an ongoing duty of the Leadership Development Committee. Also on the committee's agenda is creating a **Conference-wide** data base of lay leadership experience and skills, and identifying ways we can leverage technology, especially video-conferencing. With our conference so geographically wide-spread we are seeking tools that can make us more accessible and meet in more efficient and effective ways.
